

Croydon Disability Register and Access Card

Croydon Council have partnered with Nimbus Disability to offer a discount card to all children and young people on our disability register. The card is free and is part of a national Access Card scheme, giving benefits and discounts to facilities and activities across the country.

About the Access Card

Croydon has bought into the National Access Card Scheme for children and young people with disabilities. If you register with Croydon's disability register it will be free.

The Access Card is widely accepted as proof of a disabled person's needs, and provides access to concessions such as free companion passes and tickets. The card has symbols which confirm a person's needs, to inform providers quickly and discreetly about the support that may be required.

Visit www.accesscard.org.uk/find-a-credable-provider/ to see all the organisations which offer benefits to Access Card holders. Many organisations not listed still provide benefits, so keep your card with you just in case.

We have sent parents/carers a text message with the link so you can look at the scheme and decide if you want to register your child and get access to the free card.

Gatwick is the first UK airport to open passenger sensory room

Gatwick Airport has recently opened a sensory room in an attempt to help calm passengers who feel overwhelmed in busy and unfamiliar airport surroundings.

The new space sits in the North Terminal and is designed specifically for people with autism, dementia, cognitive impairment or other special needs.

What is it?

Passengers using the room have the opportunity to manipulate the lighting to create a range of different looks and feels for the room. You can transform the space into a calming and relaxing environment or a stimulating interactive space full of light and sound with just the flick of a switch. The room also comes equipped with a 'chill-out zone' filled with floor cushions, bean bags and digital display panels, which generate colourful visual wall features. The area has capacity to seat up to 90 people, providing plenty of opportunities for passengers to experience the premium lounge feel pre- flight, without being surrounded by too many people.

The facilities also come with a separate 'interactive zone' which looks to stimulate the senses using a great range of tactile panels, textures and a game to improve memory, motor skills and encourage learning. The room is free to all passengers departing from the airport, with 45 minute sessions available to book from the assistance desk found after security.





Sun Cream
